Northern Delaware Greenway Trail

This 7.5 mile shared-use trail links Bellevue State Park with Brandywine Park and the City of Wilmington through a series of trails that travel some of the most beautiful landscapes in Delaware. In Brandywine Park, the trail is a wide, paved surface. Take in views of the Brandywine River, Jasper Crane Rose Garden, or use the trail to walk to the Brandywine Zoo.

East Coast Greenway

The East Coast Greenway is an urban trail system linking local trails to form a 3,000 mile continuous route from Maine to Florida. This multiuse trail spans 16 states and links 25 major cites. In Delaware, the East Coast Greenway crosses through northern New Castle County passing through Newark and the city of Wilmington. Near Wilmington, the trail follows the entire alignment of the Northern Delaware Greenway Trail.
